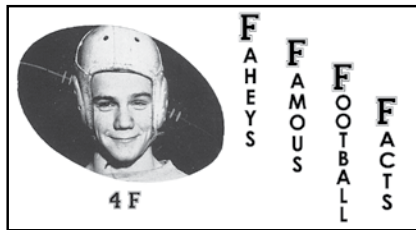

computer) and keeping your antivirus program up to date. John also recommended Apple products as all software installed on their systems must be certified through Apple. **Barry** asked about the cost of rebuilding a computer (\$100-\$150). **Clark** asked another question about using a cloud based back-up system. Bob Levy asked about using the preview panel in Outlook (Outlook blocks most web based, negative comment from coming through the panel.). John also schooled us on WIFI, advising that we use a password protected system. Judith asked about using a USB system for backing up (handy but still exposed to theft and fire risks that cloud back-ups don't have). **Tim Roberts** asked about the lock symbol in the address bar (gives a false sense of security) and **Carl** asked about the encryption used on cloud servers. Great program, no question. Next up was **Errol** who recognized our birthdays, including **Bill Fahey's**, who he said looks good for 97. Errol also stressed the importance of spreading the word about our Arts, Crafts and Wine Festival to other Rotary clubs; they will support our event. We also received an envelope of four wine tasting tickets to sell for our Arts, Crafts and Wine Festival (the tickets are good for any of the three tastings), and received a general update on the event planning. We will reach the 100 vendor booths we budgeted. We also learned that Cox has permitted us to find some of our own sponsors, looking to recover about \$3,000 worth of hard costs for the event. **Joe Williams** stressed the need for the Club's support for the event, including selling the four tickets. Joe also let us know that the bell ringing sign-up has commenced, hoping that we will retain our title as the top collecting organization in Seminole County. We are competing with some big organizations (including the Sheriff's office who, as Joe said, have guns!). Barry was happy to report that the Lyman Interact club will be helping us with the Arts, Crafts and Wine Festival as well as with the bell ringing. This club is extremely active and successful and we're happy to have their help. **Dennis** called out for UCF football game tickets, a great deal at \$25. Only 12 of the 50 tickets committed to by the Club have been sold. Dennis also passed the bucket for our next Coalition feeding, later this month. **Dr. Rosenberg** had a shot at our drawing, now grown to \$960, but it rolls again with just 8 cards remaining.

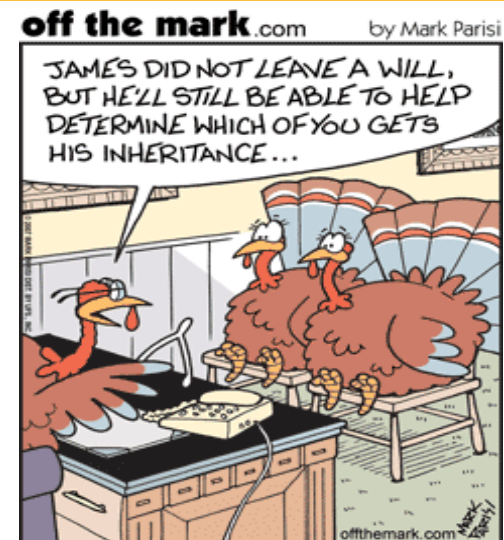

LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Last week, our program was presented by one of our own, **John Costello**. John spoke to the Club about computer security, a topic about which he has vast knowledge. There are a host of real concerns in our current day and age when a large portion of our lives are governed by computers and technology. Computer viruses are getting increasingly smart and sophisticated. Some of the most dangerous download to your computer and wait until you visit a financial related site. The virus duplicates the log on screen and takes your information. It also frequently asks you for additional information, such as your Social Security number, looking just like a genuine request from your financial institution. Computer bugs come in many different shapes and sizes. There are botnets (these nasties obtain full access to your system and sell your information), spyware (these lay dormant but collect information and sell it on), adware (mostly pop-ups), viruses (these stay on your computer and cause issues), worms (these attack all the computers on your network) and scareware (these creatures look like a Windows security alert, but aren't). John also showed us a great video of the Zeus virus which showed the screens on the victim's computer and the hacker's. This virus is particularly insidious, granting the hacker carte blanche access to your system, installing other viruses or monitoring programs. As far as protections, the best one is common sense. Don't give out personal information. Another good idea is to frequently update your operating system. Also, if something comes from someone you know, don't automatically trust it as their system may have been infected. John's very topical presentation prompted a host of questions from members. **Judith Topper** asked a great question about getting viruses on your phone (phones are generally safer than a Windows based computer). **Larry Breen** asked about identity theft, which has gone beyond just stealing your identity to clearing out your financial accounts. John particularly warned us about theft from brokerage accounts as they aren't covered by insurance. Once your money is gone, it's gone. If a hacker gets your log in information, they can sell all the securities and send the proceeds to another account. (John recommended checking your accounts frequently, watching for any unauthorized changes, and set up e-mail warnings. He also discussed using "RSA tokens" which change your password every 60 seconds.) **Bob Levy** asked about backing-up to the cloud. John highly recommended this process as it's quite safe. **Rege** asked about the effectiveness of anti-virus programs. John told us that most viruses disable your anti-virus programs, a step that your anti-virus program usually warns you about. As far as getting rid of a virus once you have one, the best option is to rebuild your system. John also gave us a few tips for safer computing, including setting up a user account (rather than operating as an administrator, particularly if you have a child using the
