Memorial Day

As nearly everyone knows, Memorial Day, is celebrated the last Monday of each May to honor U.S. soldiers killed while in military service. It was first commonly referred to as Decoration Day and honored Union and Confederate soldiers killed in the Civil War. However, its scope was expanded to honor any American dying in war following World War I. Of course, many other events have fallen on Memorial Day weekend for many years, including the Indianapolis 500 (starting in 1911) and the Coca-Cola 600 (starting in 1960). Interestingly, there is special treatment for the flag on Memorial Day, with the flag being raised briskly to the top of the pole and then solemnly lowered to half staff where it remains only until noon, when it is raised to the top again, signifying rising up in their stead to continue the fight for liberty and justice for all.
