LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Last week, our speaker was Ms. Karen Bacharach from the Center for Independent Living (CIL). This organization assists people with disabilities to stay in their homes and remain functioning members of society. She noted the 21st anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act which she credited with breaking down the wall presented by disabilities. We see the Act at work everyday in such things as wheelchair ramps and special parking. People with disabilities constituted the largest "minority" population in the United States; 1 of every 5 Americans. Ms. Bacharach also clarified that all disabilities aren't physical and they are not always permanent. The CIL also helps their clients with housing issues, provides education and mental health counseling and provides information and referrals to those impacted by a disability. Their counseling services help people get to the next, post-disability point in their lives. They also help provide specific equipment to meet their clients' needs. Karen also shared a couple stories about people her organization has helped. One gentleman, a very active individual, lost both his legs and decided to move to Florida. The change of scenery didn't benefit him as much as he had expected and CIL helped provide counseling and employment assistance as well as taught him a little about the local landscape and ways to get around town. Despite their disabilities, these people are the same people they were before, with the same heart. One of the biggest tasks the CIL undertakes is help with peoples' living accommodations. Not only do they help with the physical part of this task (ramps and such), they help keep people in their home by avoiding foreclosure (credit and budget counseling). This area is also where they put most of their volunteers to work; directly helping those in need by building ramps. The CIL's employment services are also a keystone of their work. They work extensively with small businesses to help them prepare for and hire disabled workers. They also help individuals find jobs, placing over 30 people this year. While people with all types of disabilities are assisted, they have particular success with the deaf, helping them learn to sign, use special telephones and learn Skype to communicate with others. The CIL has an upcoming fund-raiser in Baldwin Park, essentially a "walk-a-thon" using wheelchairs. **Bob Levy** asked about their method for determining permanent vs. temporary disabilities; the answer being that CIL helps anyone who needs the help, while they don't engage in physical rehab type activities. **Fred Poole** asked about getting help for employers to enable an employee on the job. Following our speaker, we were very happy to recognize **Sheila Brown** as having returned to the Club after a long hiatus. Of course, her birthday was duly acknowledged. President **Paul** updated us on the Arts, Crafts and Wine Festival planned for Cranes Roost on November 19-20. This effort is going to be labor intensive and we'll need a lot of volunteers to make the event a success. We're projected to need the help of 80 some people! **Jeff Bass** reminded us about the upcoming golf tournament.
